WE HEAR GOD'S HOLY WORD PROCLAIMED

INTRODUCTION

We are called by our Baptism to walk in the ways of the Lord. The lesson from Deuteronomy reminds us of how closely God wishes to be in our hearts, minds, and souls. We all have a responsibility to the next generations to continue a relationship with God. The Psalm is in praise of happiness. Not the happiness of the world but the happiness found only in God through listening and acting on His direction. Paul exhorts us to share the Gospel, no matter what. For it is through the Gospel God and our salvation is revealed. The Gospel lessen is from the closing words of Jesus' sermon on the mount, building the house on the rock and not on the sand are about hearing and obeying God's word.

The First Lesson is from Deuteronomy chapter 11 verses 18-22, 26-28

God's words and commandments were to always be the foremost guiding principles for God's faithful people.

¹⁸You shall put these words of mine in your heart and soul, and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and fix them as an emblem on your forehead. ¹⁹Teach them to your children, talking about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. ²⁰Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, ²¹so that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land that the LORD swore to your ancestors to give them, as long as the heavens are above the earth. ²²If you will diligently observe this entire commandment that I am commanding you, loving the LORD your God, walking in all his ways, and holding fast to the Lord,

²⁶See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse: ²⁷the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the LORD your God that I am commanding you today; ²⁸and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn from the way that I am commanding you today, to follow other gods that you have not known.

Jesus concludes his Sermon on the Mount with the following words, asking those who were following him to not only hear his words, but to live them out day by day in all they said and did.

²¹"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven. ²²On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many deeds of power in your name?' ²³Then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; go away from me, you evildoers.' ²⁴"Everyone then who hears

these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. ²⁵The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. ²⁶And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. ²⁷The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell — and great was its fall!" ²⁸Now when Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were astounded at his teaching, ²⁹for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes.
